Building 95 Fire – What We Know



- On August 18th, there was a failure in the electrical room on the 42nd floor that caused a fire to break out around 11:00am
- Toronto Fire Chief Pegg and City Councillor Robinson have confirmed no one was seriously injured
- There was major smoke damage to the entire 42nd floor; power and internet outages initially affected floors 40-44, eventually expanding to the east side of floors 24-44
- Power was restored to most floors by mid-afternoon on Aug 19, Rogers internet was gradually restored as of Aug 22
- Repairs on floors 40-44 are ongoing; some restoration equipment and personnel are still on site
- Fire Department response was swift; declared a 3 Alarm Fire and dispatched 34 units to our property
- Communication with residents during the active fire was challenging due to the ongoing intercom alarm
- Once the fire was extinguished, residents were able to call 85 security and arrange to be escorted out of the building by Fire Department Staff via elevator
- Morguard ensured lanterns were provided to tenants during the power outage and hotel accommodation was offered to residents of floors 42-44

High-Rise Fire Survival Kit



The Toronto Fire Services recommends a high-rise survival kit for tenants of high buildings, readily available if they become trapped during a fire. You can purchase the following list of items for less than \$50. Having these items available for emergency use may improve your chances of surviving a fire.

- Wet towel – Place at the base of a door
- Duct tape – Tape over door and vent openings
- Foil wrap – Use to cover vent openings
- Whistle – Use to signal for help
- Flashlight – Use in case of power failure, smoke, or to signal for help
- Bright-coloured cloth – Hang up in a window, or on a balcony, to identify your location
- Ink marker – Use for messages on cloth, door or windows
- Cotton bedsheet – If smoke is heavy in your room, soak the bed sheet with water and make a tent near an open window
- Washcloth – Place the wet cloth over your mouth and nose to aid breathing in smoke-filled areas
- Fire safety plan – Have a copy of your building's emergency procedures available
- Plastic pail with lid – Use for storing survival equipment (Fill with water during a fire)
